Health & Safety First

With 50 fatalities and 2.3 million working days lost in England in the past 12 months a result of workplace injury for work-related ill health, the need to prioritise safety was emphasised at the conference in Cheltenham.

Speaking at Carter Construction's annual health-and-safety conference event for employees, Managing Director Michael Carter said that, despite tough economic conditions, it was no time to take short cuts with people's welfare, health and safety.

With an estimated 4,784 reported over-3 day injuries in the construction industry, Mr Carter said the company's excellent health-and-safety record continued to contribute to its overall success.

'Working safely while maintaining clean and tidy sites that do not impinge on our neighbours, is now firmly-established and embedded in our culture' said Mr Carter
